4. Do you support the Sunlight for Unaccountable Non-Profits Act (SUN Act) (S. 229 in the 114th Congress)?
The SUN Act, introduced in the 114th Congress by Sen. Jon Tester (D-MT), would require all social welfare organization spend money attempting to influence an election to disclose with the FEC all donors giving more than \$5,000. Social welfare organization that do not engage in electioneering would be allowed to keep their donors secret.
