I oppose *Citizens United* because it helped allow for unlimited corporate contributions by Super PACs and gives an unfair financial advantage to large corporations during our elections. I support curbing the influence of outside money in elections and instituting further reform of public financing for campaigns moving forward. I am a cosponsor of H. J. Res. 31, which is a constitutional amendment to address *Citizens United* by giving specific authority to Congress and the states to regulate corporate expenditures in elections (including by distinguishing between natural persons and corporations). In addition, I am a cosponsor of H.R. 1134, the *DISCLOSE Act* which would increase disclosure by corporations of political spending to shareholders, require them to "stand by their ads," and improve public reporting. Finally, I am a cosponsor of H.R. 20, the *Government by the People Act*. This bill would institute election reforms with the intent of increasing small contributions, raising civic engagement, and reducing the influence of Super PACs. Please know that I will continue to work towards an election system that is open and fair for everyone.
