I knock tens of thousands of doors to talk directly to voters and understand their concerns, and I rely on thousands of small donors to finance these aggressive direct voter contact efforts. I don't take corporate PAC money and I never will. Unaccountable money can effectively shut people like me out of running for office - people who are willing to stand up to the wealthy and big corporations and fight for working families and their interests. I fully support overturning Citizens United and its related cases and banning corporate money in politics. I would love to see a public campaign financing system that levels the playing field for candidates from diverse backgrounds, and allows passionate candidates like myself to spend a hell of a lot more time talking to voters instead of calling donors and raising money. The amount of money in politics today has totally corrupted the process, and made winning elections about racing to raise as much cash as possible without any meaningful connection to the people we're trying to serve and help. In Congress I will be a staunch voice against corporate money and for public financing that allows me to focus on my residents, not donors, and that allows a diverse range of candidates to express their ideas without being crushed by big corporate dollars.
