There is absolutely too much money in American politics today, and it's hurting our entire system. As I was contemplating this run for office, I was told that I would need to take a year off from work, just to campaign. This was shocking to me, and immediately eliminates a vast majority of the population, making our government not truly representative. After all, how many people have enough savings to survive for a year without work? It is appalling that, once in office, our representatives need to spend half of their time raising money when they should be focused on legislating. And, finally, it is scary to think that our representatives can be bought and sold. Even when transparent, we see the influence that big oil, big pharma, and the NRA have on elected officials' votes.

Citizens United is the biggest contributor to this issue. It has ushered in an unprecedented wave of corporate spending and dark money disguised by shell corporations. I disagree with the Supreme Court's ruling in Citizens United: these bottomless contributions of course influence the way a politician votes. Just look at how big pharma has prevented Congress from taking common-sense steps to lower prescription drug prices. Our government is being manipulated by a very few, very powerful players.

The first step we need to take is to overturn Citizens United. Unfortunately, the same politicians who benefit from unlimited contributions are holding up legislation to return to a more accountable campaign finance system. That's why I admire and support the work that End Citizens United is doing to help counteract the effects of unlimited contributions and by helping to elect politicians who will fight for campaign finance reform, just like I will.
