Methodology


Greenberg Quinlan Rosner Research conducted a phone survey of 1,000 2018 general election voters in a national battleground of Congressional Districts on November 8-12, 2018.

The data are subject to a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence interval; margin of error is higher among subgroups.



An overwhelming majority support reform legislation, more intensity among independents




