Subject: Trump, Perdue Narrowly Trailing Democratic Opponents in Georgia; Voters Support Vote-by-Mail and Anti-Corruption Reforms

Date: June 15, 2020

A new Public Policy Polling survey conducted on behalf of End Citizens United and Let America Vote finds that Joe Biden leads President Donald Trump by 2 points (48-46) among Georgia voters, while Trump is also underwater in favorability by 3 points (44/47). Incumbent Georgia Republicans are also unpopular among voters—a plurality hold an unfavorable opinion of Senator David Perdue (36/42) and Senator Kelly Loeffler (28/47).

In the Georgia Senate race, Democrat Jon Ossoff leads Senator Perdue by 1 point (45-44), but Ossoff has ample opportunity to increase his lead. After voters learn more about the contrast between Ossoff and Perdue, his lead increases to 9 points (49-40).

A majority of Georgians also support various reform proposals for voting and preventing corruption in both political parties.

- 57% support a plan to expand vote-by-mail options to make it easier for people to vote who may not be comfortable going to polling places due to the coronavirus. This includes a majority of Democrats (83%) and independents (56%), while only 33% overall oppose it.
- 55% support HR1, the biggest anti-corruption bill in history, including a majority of Democrats (66%) and independents (51%), and a plurality of Republicans (45%). Just 17% overall oppose it.
- 51% support a ban on members of Congress owning individual stocks, and just 28% oppose it. Those in support include a majority of Democrats (51%) and independents (53%) and nearly half of Republicans (49%).

Public Policy Polling surveyed 661 Georgia voters from June 12-13, 2020. The margin of error is +/- 3.8%. 50% of interviews for the survey were conducted by telephone, and 50% by text message.
